**Did you know?** Did you know that America's early astronauts practically turned the Chevrolet Corvette into the unofficial car of the space program? The tradition began with Alan Shepard, the first American in space, who owned a 1957 Corvette and famously bragged that it went "like a bat out of hell". When Shepard visited Detroit after his historic flight, he met GM design chief Bill Mitchell, who was so captivated by the astronauts' daring image that he helped spark a unique relationship between NASA's space pioneers and America's most iconic sports car. Soon, Corvettes became a common sight around Cape Canaveral, driven by test pilots who were already accustomed to pushing machines to their limits.

The connection grew even stronger when a Florida Chevrolet dealer, Jim Rathmann—himself a former Indy 500 champion—arranged a special lease program that allowed astronauts to drive brand-new Corvettes for just \$1 a year. This led to legendary scenes like the Apollo 12 crew posing with their matching custom-painted C3 Corvettes in blue and gold, and astronauts like Buzz Aldrin and the Apollo 15 crew proudly showing off their cars next to lunar rovers. The Corvette became more than transportation—it was a symbol of speed, innovation, and the fearless spirit of the space race. Even today, astronauts like Scott Kelly continue the tradition, proving that the bond between Corvettes and space explorers is as enduring as the American drive to reach for the stars.

# LET'S SEE WHAT AI HAS TO SAY ABOUT...

With the use of Artificial Intelligence there is so much information right at your fingertips! With that in mind I thought how about a series on Care and Craftsmanship. Let's start with Detailing your Corvette!

**My question to COPILOT:** *I need a one-page article for my newsletter that discusses how enthusiasts address cold weather and whether to store it or keep driving it in winter.*

## Care and Craftsmanship Series: **Winter Storage & Protection**

When the temperatures drop, many Corvette owners face the tough choice: keep driving or tuck their cars away until spring. Proper winter storage is more than just parking—it's about preserving your Corvette's condition and ensuring it's ready to roar when the weather warms.

### **Preparing for Storage**

- **Clean Thoroughly** – Wash, dry, and wax to protect paint from dust and moisture.
- **Interior Care** – Vacuum carpets, treat leather, and wipe down surfaces to prevent mildew or cracking.
- **Fuel System** – Add a fuel stabilizer to prevent varnish and gum buildup.
- **Battery Maintenance** – Disconnect or use a battery tender to keep it charged without overloading.
- **Tires** – Inflate to recommended pressure and consider tire cradles to prevent flat spots.

### **Storage Environment**

- **Car Covers** – Use a breathable, fitted cover to shield against dust while preventing trapped moisture.
- **Climate Control** – If possible, store in a dry, temperature-controlled garage.
- **Rodent Prevention** – Seal entry points and avoid leaving food nearby.

### **The Spring Payoff**

Taking these steps ensures your Corvette emerges from storage looking sharp and running strong. It's peace of mind for owners who value both performance and preservation.
